#### PLAINTIFF'S ORIGINAL COMPLAINT

#### TO THE HONORABLE JUDGE OF THIS COURT:

Plaintiff Jennifer M. Novak ("Novak") files her Original Complaint, complaining of Celltex Therapeutics Corporation ("Celltex"), and for cause of action respectfully shows the Court the following:

### **Introduction**

- 1. This action seeks actual damages, liquidated damages, attorney's fees, expert witness fees, taxable costs of court, and pre-judgment and post-judgment interest as allowed by law for Defendant Celltex's failure to pay Plaintiff overtime for hours worked in excess of forty hours a week, in violation of the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. § 201 et seq. ("FLSA").
  - 2. Plaintiff demands a jury trial on all issues triable to a jury.

## **Parties**

- 3. Plaintiff is an individual who resides in Harris County, Texas.
- 4. Defendant Celltex Therapeutics Corporation is a Texas corporation that maintains its principal place of business at 5701 Woodway Drive, Suite 300, Houston, Texas 77057 and

may be served through its registered agent, Grant Cook, 5701 Woodway Drive, Suite 300, Houston, Texas 77057.

- 5. Defendant Celltex is the former employer of Plaintiff.
- 6. Defendant Celltex is an enterprise engaged in commerce or the production of goods for commerce within the meaning of the FLSA, and is obligated to pay its employees in accordance with the FLSA. Defendant Celltex was obligated to pay its employees in accordance with the FLSA at all times Plaintiff worked for Celltex.

#### **Jurisdiction and Venue**

- 7. This Court has jurisdiction over all claims in this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1331 because Plaintiff's claims arise under federal law.
- 8. Venue is proper in the Western District of Texas pursuant to agreement of the parties.
  - 9. All conditions precedent to filing this lawsuit have been met.

#### **Facts**

- 10. Plaintiff was paid a salary despite having primary functions that did not qualify for any exemption under the FLSA.
- 11. In her position with Defendant Celltex, Plaintiff routinely worked in excess of 40 hours a week. In many instances, Plaintiff worked in excess of 55 hours per week.
- 12. Plaintiff was a non-exempt employee entitled to overtime pursuant to the FLSA. However, Defendant Celltex failed to pay Plaintiff overtime for any hours worked in excess of forty hours per week.

13. Defendant Celltex knew or showed reckless disregard for whether its failure to pay Plaintiff overtime for hours worked in excess of 40 hours a week was in violation of the FLSA.

#### **Causes of Action**

- 14. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all of the foregoing allegations in each of the paragraphs above as if fully set forth herein.
- 15. Defendant Celltex's conduct and practices violated the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act, 29 U.S.C. § 201 et seq., including but not limited to violations of § 207(a)(1).
  - 16. Defendant's violations of the FLSA were willful violations.

## **Attorney's Fees**

- 17. Plaintiff incorporates by reference all of the foregoing allegations in each of the paragraphs above as if fully set forth herein.
- 18. Plaintiff is entitled to attorney's fees and costs for bringing this action pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 216(b).

#### **Damages**

19. As a result of Defendant's conduct, Plaintiff seeks relief pursuant to 29 U.S.C. § 216(b) which includes, but is not limited to, (i) overtime wages for all unpaid hours worked in excess of forty hours per week at the rate of one and one-half times her regular rate; (ii) liquidated damages as allowed by law; (iii) costs, expert witness fees and attorney's fees; (iv) pre-judgment and post-judgment interest as allowed by law; and (v) such other relief, legal or equitable, as may be warranted or to which Plaintiff may be justly entitled.

## **Jury Demand**

20. Plaintiff requests a trial by jury.

#### **Prayer**

- 21. WHEREFORE, Plaintiff Jennifer M. Novak respectfully prays that upon final hearing and trial hereof, this Court finds for Plaintiff and awards her:
  - a. Overtime wages for all unpaid hours worked in excess of forty hours at the rate of one and one-half times her regular rate;
  - b. An equal amount of overtime wages awarded as liquidated damages as allowed under the FLSA;
  - c. Attorney's fees for this case and any and all appeals;
  - d. Pre-judgment and post-judgment interest as allowed by law;
  - e. Costs of court and other costs of prosecuting Plaintiff's claims;
  - f. Expert witness fees; and
  - g. Such other relief, legal or equitable, as Plaintiff may be justly entitled.
